2011 MINUTES OF THE PLANNING ADVISORY & HIGHWAYS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 1ST AUGUST 2023

Members having previously been circulated with the minutes of the Planning Advisory & Highway Committee meeting held on 1st August 2023 were amended to record Cllr Woods as having tendered his apologies. Due to the low attendance it was **AGREED** to defer confirming the minutes until the next meeting.

2012 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No declarations were received.

2013 PLANNING ISSUES

(a) To CONSIDER the following PLANNING APPLICATIONS:

1. P/RES/2022/04434

LAND TO THE NORTH & WEST OF COCKROAD LANE

Application for the approval of layout, scale, appearance and landscaping (condition 2-the reserved matters), construction traffic management plan (condition 6), attenuation pond details (condition 9), finished floor levels (condition 10), tree protection details (condition 11), ground remediation scheme (condition 12), biodiversity mitigation and enhancement plan (condition 14), highway details (condition 17), bridge details (condition 18), electric vehicle charging points (condition 19) and travel plan (condition 20) pursuant to outline planning permission ref. WD/D/19/000613 for the erection of 58 No. dwellings and associated works (amended plans/information).

Recommend refusal on the following grounds:

ENV13 - new buildings were expected to achieve high standards of environmental performance however there was no mention of:

Solar Panels

- Triple Glazing
- Water Collection
- Ground Source Heat Pumps within the development.

COM7 - creating a safe and efficient transport network - there is minimal public transport in Beaminster serving nearest towns of Crewkerne and Bridport. There is not the employment within Beaminster, occupiers of the houses will have to travel by car for work and leisure purposes.

COM9 - parking standards in new developments - does the parking provision within the plan meet the required criteria

COM10 - utility services infrastructure - can the developers demonstrate, bearing in mind a development of a similar size on an adjacent site:

- current energy supplies were sufficient for the number of EV charging points identified
- surface water run off, there was no mention of semi-permemble membranes, existing culverts fed from the site in some locations were inadequate to take large volumes of water
- Sewerage treatment plant in the town is already under immense pressure
- water pressure in that area of the town is very poor

Overall the layout of the site had not been well thought out with the provision of a childrens play area located on the perimeter of the development with minimal visibility from dwellings posing potential security risk to children, how does the developer plan to mitigate the risk.

The attenuation pond, with no protective measures poses a serious risk of drowning, how does the developer plan to mitigate the risk.

(a) Broadwindsor Road/Whitcombe Road – uneven road surface
